



Show Rules and Regulations

All llamas should be registered or eligible to be registered by show time.

1. Llamas must be entered in the class that best describes their fiber type and coverage. Shorn animals must be in the class they would have been in prior to shearing.
2. The judge is the only person authorized to make a class change once the class has started.
3. Handler attire should be neat and appropriate.
4. Llamas must be present for judging in a properly fitting halter and lead rope.
5. Handlers will be at ring side 5 minutes before the start of the class.
6. No youth under the age of 12 may handle an intact male over 2 years of age.

Llama fiber divisions and Age divisions:

Light to medium fiber: moderate body fiber, moderate neck fiber smooth to moderate head, leg and ear fiber. Judged 80% on conformation, 20% on fiber.

Heavy fiber: abundant fiber on body, neck, ears, legs, and head. Example: leg fiber past the knee and hock. Judged 70% on conformation, 30% on fiber.

Suri fiber: long body fiber that has no crimp and hangs parallel to the body and twists into pencil or rope like locks. Judged 60% on conformation, 40% on fiber.

Age is determined as the age of the animal at the date of the show.

Juvenile: 5 months on the date of the show and under 12 months.

Yearling: 12 months on the date of the show and under 24 months.

Adult: 24 months and older on the date of the show.

Showmanship Guidelines:

This class demonstrates the handler's ability to present their llama to its best advantage. The conformation of the llama is should not to be considered. Handler's attire be neat, clean, and appropriate for the class. Judge may request any of the following exercise:

1. back up and lead forward
2. change positions in the line up
3. exchange animals
4. answer questions on general knowledge
5. demonstrate a change of pace
6. touch the animal to check grooming
7. follow directions from the judge or ring steward

Obstacle guidelines:

1. All obstacles will be safe for exhibitors of all ages.
2. Please have llamas trained to lead well.
3. All classes are entered "at your own risk".
4. A handler may enter with more than one llama as per CLASS rules



5. Points will be recorded for the CLASS show system

Costume Class: Handler and llama should be in costume. **Each participant should bring a CD with them of the music they would like to walk to once around the ring.**

In halter classes ribbons will be presented to 4th place.

Fleece Show: 1. Traditional Fleece 2.Suri Fleece

1st shearing: .llama shorn under 15 months 2nd shearing: no more than 15 months shearing

Successive shearings: no more than 15 months growth

Bring barrel cuts as free of debris as possible with out grooming to the registration desk upon arrival. There will be a form to fill out to enter your fleece in the proper category.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **Shorn and not brushed prior to shearing**
- **Prime fibre from barrel area only**
- **Handpicked of debris and second cuts**
- **Roll fleece**
- **Submitted in clear unmarked plastic bag**
- **To be judged by exhibitor number only when presented to the judge**

Fleece shall not be:

- **washed before or after shearing**
- **have crème rinse or other chemicals applied prior to or after shearing**
- **have guard hair removed**
- **have insect or parasite infection**

Length of fibre:

- **3 inches minimum**
- **8 inches maximum**

**It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to apply the fleece descriptions for entry.
However, the fleece judge will have the discretion to determine if the fleeces have**



been entered into the correct class and move them to the appropriate division if deemed necessary.

FLEECE ENTRY FORM:

To include the following data:

- date of shearing
- date of previous shearing
- name of llama
- name of owner and address

PREPARING YOUR FLEECE FOR FLEECE COMPETITION

- Prime (blanket fleece only)
- Handle gently as to not disrupt the locks
- Shake to remove any dust
- Remove second cuts
- Remove urine stains, mud, excessive vegetation (particularly remove the bird's nest at the base of the neck.
- Remove anything that you do not consider the blanket area (skirting) (see diagram)
- Ensure staple length is not less than 3" or over 8" .
- Place prepared fleece flesh side down, fold right and left sides in toward the middle. Start from the rear and roll fleece up to the front
- If the fleece is in two (right and left side of shear) roll them separately
- Place in clear plastic bags with appropriate label (supplied by show) in the bag
- Placing tissue on fleece prior to rolling helps the judge to gently unroll the fleece 😊 *You don't gain points but it helps in laying the fleece out by the judge..*

Don't hesitate to skirt as needed. What points you gain in fleece weight will be lost on improper skirting and cleanliness.

The judge will be looking for: fineness and handle. Uniformity of micron, brightness, uniformity of color, character, uniformity of length, density, impurities, stain, tip damage, modulation: guard hairs, amount of.
